Principal's Message

At assembly on Thursday last week I spoke with the students around the responsibilities that the Department of Education has for its Principals. One of those is the grounds for suspension. For some students this is the last thing that they need to listen to at an assembly as it is taking away from their learning time. For others it does provide some reassurance about having a school which everyone is able to enjoy.

The students were then given a quick presentation by our local Police member Mr Paul Newton outlining the responsibilities they have in regard to the law. The particular focus was on underage drinking. The law is clear that it is against the law to buy alcohol if you are under 18 years old. You may not carry alcohol in a public place. This includes the school bus network. If you are attending a party and you are under age you do need written permission from your parent to the adult who is supervising that party. If you are intoxicated at that party that is an offence. The supervisor is responsible for that and Victoria Police will have to make a mandatory report to DFHS. Businesses that sell alcohol to minors can face a fine of \$10,904.40 which is 60 penalty units which currently is at the rate of \$181.74 per unit. An adult who does buy alcohol for a minor can also be fined.

The point of this presentation was to ensure that our students are informed about their responsibilities and understand the implications if they choose to act outside of the laws that the government has set to develop a healthy happy community.

Students in Years 7-10 had another presentation from members of Victoria Police yesterday which made clear to them what the laws are around cyber bullying and harassment, and gave advice on how to be cyber safe.

Most students do the right thing most of the time or even all of the time, so we just need to help the few who need to reconsider some of their choices.
