# We also have just signed up to recycle batteries!

Batteries should never be put in the recycling bin or in your waste bin. Rechargeable batteries and lithium ion batteries are hazardous and could produce sparks that may start a fire in the trucks or recycling facility. This includes batteries in laptops, mobile phones, power tools and cameras.

Batteries can be processed to recover plastics and metals, some of which are used to manufacture new batteries.

**Batteries 4 Planet Ark** is a recycling program that provides a cost effective and accessible solution for workplaces to safely collect and recycle handheld batteries. This way we can keep batteries and the hazardous materials they contain out of landfill and ensure they are safely recycled.

We will be able to recycle all of the batteries we use at school, which is great, but please note that this program is NOT for public collections of batteries.
